Dear Jennifer Vinh and Peter Campbell,

These proposed changes (PAR 1111 and 1121) will negatively affect average citizens and those least able to afford the financial impact. I have read the agency cost analysis which fails to address a multitude factors that influence cost. My costs as a senior on a fixed income will include expensive upgrades to my home before I can ever install a heat pump. Those costs are not factored into the equation.

A greater issue is that these measures are unlikely to decrease greenhouse gases without first addressing the electrical grid's use of natural gas. Given that 36% of our electricity comes from natural gas, wouldn't it be more prudent to target zero emissions from the grid first? <https://calmatters.org/environment/climate-change/2024/08/california-clean-power-progress-grid/> Rather than move forward with inflationary costs for the average consumer, why not fix the current grid which cannot support the increasing reliance on electricity.

I just don't see an upside to the goal of decreasing greenhouse gases in these proposals. Burning more fossil fuels to create electricity and contributing to consumer inflation is counter intuitive.
