Re: Support for Proposed Amended Rules 1111 +1121

Dear Chair Delgado and Members of the Board:

On behalf of the Sierra Club Angeles Chapter and our over 30,000 members in Los Angeles and Orange Counties, we write our support for rules 1111 and 1121. These rules are essential for cutting deadly pollution from fossil fuel furnaces and water heaters.

The recent revisions to the rules favor the fossil fuel industry and have significantly delayed pollution reductions that communities living with some of the worst air quality in the country urgently need. However, the new proposal still has overwhelming support from those who have participated in the rulemaking process. Though they might be imperfect, we need to pass these rules in order to continue our work to protect clean air and our climate, and to continue strengthening standards for these appliances moving forward.

Throughout working group meetings and stationary source committee meetings, staff and the public have presented the benefits of the proposed amended rules. Rules 1111 and 1121 would benefit our community in the following ways::

- **Air Quality** - More than 17 million residents in the South Coast Air Basin breathe some of the dirtiest air in the nation. The South Coast region has consistently failed to meet federal and state air quality standards for more than 30 years. These rules would cut deadly pollution from fossil fuel furnaces and water heaters.
- **Affordability**- The best way to address affordability is to adopt strong zero-emission standards. SCAQMD's Go Zero program will support an equitable transition by allocating 75% of funding to overburdened communities and will be stackable with other incentives available to Southern California households.
- **Market Transformation**- Heat pumps are rapidly becoming the dominant heating technology nationwide - outselling gas furnaces by 37% in 2024, up dramatically from a 21% lead in 2023. This accelerating market dominance shows SCAQMD can confidently

move forward with an accelerated implementation timeline, knowing we're joining a well-established national transition

- **Cooling Access & Energy Bills-** Heat pumps provide a transformative solution to Southern California's extreme heat crisis by delivering both heating and cooling in a single, highly efficient technology. A significant portion of Southern California households currently lack access to air conditioning, leaving them vulnerable during increasingly frequent heat waves.
- **Equity + Justice-** The air quality crisis in Southern California disproportionately impacts communities of color. SCAQMD cannot leave these communities behind.

These rules reflect an exhaustive 16-month public process and three years of Air Quality Management Plan development. We look forward to your vote to pass these rules on Friday at the June Governing Board meeting and seeing the successful transition to clean equipment with the support of the Go Zero Program.
