I've lived in Los Angeles for the past two years, and am writing to urge you to pass Rules 1111 and 1121 today. My roommate has asthma, and since she moved to L.A. last year, it has gotten dramatically worse. We are renters, so can't necessarily make our own decisions about the appliances in our home. Passage of Rules 1111 and 1121 would help countless people in similar situations, who have health issues aggravated by fossil gas-burning appliances.

These rules could help prevent [130 premature deaths and save over \\$2 billion in public health costs each year](#). Considering that these rules have already been substantially watered down as a result of the gas industry's lobbying efforts, passing them -- and thus preventing these deaths and additional health costs -- is the absolute minimum that SCAQMD must do to protect our communities.

Heat pumps are particularly efficient in southern California's climate and we are fortunate to have a slew of rebates, which both dramatically increase the affordability of this transition. [Heat pumps outsold gas furnaces by 32% last year](#) -- so the transition is underway, and passing these rules will keep southern California at the forefront.
