We are writing to express our very strong opposition to Rule 1121, which will mandate that broken gas water heaters be replaced with cost-prohibitive electric models as of January, 2027, and Rule 1111, which will mandate that broken natural gas furnaces be replaced with electric furnaces beginning in 2028. While you will “allow” gas appliances, these also be cost-prohibitive and poorly made.

Both of these rules, if implemented, will have financially catastrophic effects on the vast majority of consumers and businesses and will, in many cases, simply not be at all, ever, affordable. These rules will require costly and time-consuming upgrades to homes, apartments and businesses. Retired people on fixed incomes, mom and pop apartment owners and small business will be among the hardest hit by these entirely absurd rules.

If a retired couple on a fixed income needs to replace a gas furnace with electric, how will they afford not just the furnace, but the upgrade to the electric panel as well as the costly installation, including permits, for the electric furnace? The low Nox gas furnaces that you will allow are outrageously expensive and poorly made.

There is no proven benefit to replacing clean burning natural gas appliances with electric models. All of the benefits the AQMD notes are based on computer modeling, which is merely guesswork. As a retired professor of computer science and a statistician, Seth is well-versed in the worthlessness of statistics based on computer modeling.

The AQMD’s assertion that implementation of these rules will prevent 4000 premature deaths, 16,000 cases of newly onset asthma and 4000 ER visits is utterly without basis in fact. Statistically, these numbers are impossible to prove.

Several years ago, the AQMD mandated that all new gas furnaces be “low Nox” models. The cost of a gas furnace immediately doubled and the quality of the furnaces was, and remains, very poor. As verified by our heating company, which has been serving our gas furnace for fifteen years, “low Nox” furnaces break frequently and are very, very expensive to repair. Since the mandate for these furnaces, there has been absolutely no discernible improvement in the air quality in the AQMD’s four county service area.

Those of us affected by your mandates live in the real world, spend our real, hard-earned money and are very well aware that your mandates will do nothing to improve the air we breathe and the lives we live. What your mandates will do is decimate our finances and subject us to further dictatorial control over our personal choices.

We ask that you decline to pass either of these rules and allow consumers the freedom and liberty to make the choices that work for their needs and their personal finances.

I'm writing the AQMD in opposition to Proposed Amended Rules 1111 & 1121 that would required that existing gas water heaters and furnaces be substituted with electric water heaters and furnaces when replaced. In addition to not providing and real positive air quality benefit, the proposed amended rules would cause astronomic time and cost hardships on all affected. It is not just an easy matter of swapping out these pieces of equipment. Most homes, businesses, etc., that would require this type of replacement are not set up for a straight swap. For example, our home has an existing 100 amp electric panel that cannot take any additional electric load. If we were required to install and electric water heater or furnace, we would be required to upgrade the incoming service from SCE to 200 amp, upgrade our panel to 200 amp, and run dedicated circuits to those pieces of equipment. This would result in additional strain on the electric grid, plus an unnecessary expense of time and cost us thousands of dollars in electrical service upgrades.

If the AQMD is dead set on some sort of action, the least destructive to the population's finances and might actually do something to reduce NOx emissions, then enforce ultra-low NOx emission standards on all natural gas appliances. This technology is available today and can be implemented in a reasonable and nondestructive fashion.

If diversity is strength, as some are fond of saying, then diversity in energy choice is also a strength. Trying to move to an all electric future is an unrealistic and unnecessarily expensive hardship for the majority of the population with no real benefit.
