

ERRATA SHEET FOR AGENDA ITEM #30 Amend Rule 1113 – Architectural Coatings

Modify paragraph (b)(49) and subparagraph (c)(4)(B) by adding the **bold double underlined** language and deleting the ~~**bold strikeout underlined**~~ language in the proposed amended rule, as follows:

(b) Definitions

(489) SHELLACS are clear or pigmented coatings formulated solely with the resinous secretions of the lac ~~beetle-insect~~ (laccifer lacca); ~~thinned with alcohol, and~~ Shellacs are formulated to dry by evaporation without a chemical reaction providing a quick-drying, solid, protective film for priming and sealing stains and odors; and for wood finishing, ~~excluding floors effective January 1, 2007.~~ **excluding floors effective January 1, 2007.**

(c) Requirements

(4) Sell-Through Provision

(B) Any coating in containers of one quart or less that is manufactured and distributed prior to the expiration of the exemption under subparagraph (g)(1)(A) which has a VOC content above that limit specified in the Table of Standards, or shellac manufactured prior to January 1, 2007 and represented for use on wood flooring may be sold, supplied, offered for sale, or applied for up to one year after the specified effective date specified in the Table of Standards or the shellac definition. A manufacturer using this small container sell-through provision shall submit an annual report to the Executive Officer within three months of the end of the appropriate sell-through period. The report shall contain information as required by the Executive Officer to monitor the use of small containers under this provision. The manufacturer shall maintain sales and distribution records, as applicable, and such records shall clearly indicate the date of manufacture (or date code or batch code) and volume of coating sold or distributed. The manufacturer shall also provide written notice of the one year sell-through expiration date to their distribution chain. These records shall be made available to the Executive Officer upon request and shall be maintained for a period of at least three years.
